## Peer Solutions

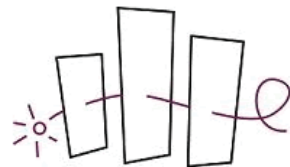
**STAND & SERVE** is a student-run club hosted by Peer Solutions designed to address the underlying conditions of sexual violence while promoting respect for self and others.

**STAND & SERVE** is an asset-driven sexual violence primary prevention program based on the Ecological Model and the 9 Principles of Effective Prevention.

**STAND & SERVE** members **Demonstrate Respect as the Norm** by replacing false norms about sexual violence with accurate information, highlighting and encouraging positive qualities. When participants learn that **respect**, not sexual violence, **is the norm**, they will be more likely to resist negative behaviors, practice “safe” bystander responsibility and therefore, halt the initial onset of harm. **We are all Peers, We are all the Solution.**

**STAND & SERVE** members are involved in program planning, development, implementation and evaluation including facilitating a concrete plan to END SEXUAL VIOLENCE IN ARIZONA.

**STAND & SERVE** members received the 2007 National Sexual Violence Prevention award from the National Sexual Violence Resource Center.

## About ADHS Sexual Violence Prevention and Education Program

The Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS) Sexual Violence and Prevention Program (SVPEP) receives funds from the Centers for Disease Control for programs aimed at preventing sexual violence and rape in Arizona. For the past seven years, through community level cooperative interventions, SVPEP has provided prevention education on rape and teen dating violence to students, professionals, and community members in Arizona.

Currently, there are seven agencies in three counties receiving funds to support a variety of primary educational programs throughout the state. Target populations include students in elementary through high school, college students, women, medical and legal professionals, law enforcement personnel, and Latino and Native American youth.

### *Funded activities include:*

- Education/training programs for students/campus personnel
- Education to increase knowledge about date rape drugs
- Other efforts to increase awareness of the facts about, or to help prevent sexual assault, including efforts to increase awareness in underserved communities, and individuals with disabilities
