Note: According to the Uniform Crime Reporting Program, violent crime consists of four offenses: murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, and assault. Forcible rape is the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will and includes rapes or attempts to commit rape by force or threat of force. Statutory rape (without force) and other sex offenses are not included.

¹ The student enrollment figures provided by the United States Department of Education are for the 2008 school year, the most recent available. The enrollment figures include full-time and part-time students.

Note: Caution should be exercised in making any intercampus comparisons or ranking schools because university/college crime statistics are affected by a variety of factors. These include demographic characteristics of the surrounding community, ratio of male to female students,
